SUNDAY REFLECTION:

Life is a matter of Choice!

This week, Sirach reminds us that we have a choice in how we act, that we are not forced, but can choose to follow God's will through our loyalty. Pressing the point on the choice we make, Sirach says: for God has set before you fire and water, life and death, good and evil, which ever you choose will be given to you. If you choose you can keep the commandment, it will save you.

In the Gospel, Jesus says our righteousness must exceed that of the Pharisees, meaning we cannot afford to settle for mere hypocrisy. He illustrates with clear examples how we are to shine as lights in the darkness that surrounds our world today.

The Psalm is a prayer in which we ask God to grant us the grace of discernment. But obviously, before we can be granted that gift, we must use our freedom of choice to ask for it - we must be willing to take the risk of finding out what God wants of us. God will never force His way on us.

That is why this week, I plead with you to freely choose, in the next couple of days, to make your pledge to the Annual Appeal. This is our way to show love and loyalty to the Church and to God Who loves. We will certainly reap the fruit of whatever we sow. Gal. 6:7.

While asking for more, I am most grateful to the 64 of you who supported the appeal last year. May God bless you.

MATTHEW 5:20

Scripture Insights

The first reading, the psalm, and the Gospel all focus on the goodness of God's law, the Torah. Sirach lays out the stark choice that Moses presented to the people as they prepared to enter the land promised to Abraham: water or fire, life or death, good or evil. God holds out life in his outstretched hand.

The psalmist pleads with God in a series of petitions — be good to me! Open my eyes. Instruct me, Give me discernment. The psalmist knows that he cannot reach out for the good without God's grace and help.

- Why does the psalmist pray for discernment?
- How might you reach out today to receive God's gift of life and goodness?
- In Jesus' teaching or life, how does he fulfill the law instead of abolishing it?
