DOMINGO DE RESURRECCIÓN DEL SEÑOR

Por eso es tan poderoso y sencillo al mismo tiempo. Los Evangelios para referirse a la resurrección usan las palabras "despertar", "levantarse" y "caminar". Podemos decir que Jesús vivió la dimensión de su resurrección en toda su vida; la amplió hasta abarcarlo todo y compartirla.

Los discípulos dan testimonio de que él, de un modo mucho más profundo y misterioso, es decir revelador, fue "despertado," a la vida por Dios; se "levanto" de la muerte y "camino," encontrándose con sus discípulos. De modo semejante, los discípulos verdaderos de Cristo caminan en el Espíritu de Jesús despiertos y convencidos de la plenitud que su vida ha otorgado a nuestras vidas pobres y encaminadas a morir.

La resurrección de Cristo nos otorga, como diría san Pablo, el fundamento y la base sólida de que resucitaremos con él. Y esta promesa es no solo para todos los seres humanos sino para toda la vida creada.

Alleluia! He is risen! Today we rejoice in the resurrection. We celebrate both our and the apostles' belief that God makes all things new.

- After reading the resurrection account in John's Gospel, reflect on the reading through art. Draw or paint the details of the reading or do an abstract piece on the transformation of all things. Or you might write a poem on new life or a first-person account of the resurrection from the perspective of Mary Magdalene, John, or Peter.
- Visit websites of art museums to see how the resurrection has been portrayed in art.
- Reflect on your life since last Easter. What is new in your life? What has been renewed? Where do you see God breaking into your life? If you have encountered difficulties and sadness during this time, ask Christ from continued healing.
