

#### **Reflection for Pentecost**

#### "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven." Jn 20:22-23

The mission of Jesus is our salvation through the forgiveness of sins and the Church is entrusted to continue this mission. This authority was given to Peter and to his successors when Jesus gave him the keys to the kingdom of heaven. This authority was confirmed on Pentecost when Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit to his apostles and said to them whose sins you forgive are forgiven.

The waters of baptism wash away original sin and the absolution at the sacrament of penance forgives sins committed after baptism. We have a whole lifetime to work on our salvation. God is so good that we have one more opportunity to obtain salvation when we are seriously ill or in danger of death by receiving the sacrament of the anointing of the sick.

We need the Church as the dispenser of God's mercy and grace. Let us pray for and work with our priests and bishops whom God has sent to us as his ordained ministers and sharers in the priesthood of Christ.

### **Practice of Faith**

On Pentecost, the new Church embarked on its mission: to go into the world, animated by that Spirit, and continue Christ's work on earth. United by the Spirit and faith, they are compelled into action, their new identity explicitly disallowing them the protection and relative peace of isolation: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21).

- The same Spirit the disciples receive, unites and is alive in us; the same mission is laid on us, and the same faith compels us forward, despite our fear or discomfort. What gift do you bring to the Body of Christ? Make a list of your gifts and how you use them.
- Pray to discern how these gifts may continue to be used to further Christ's work on earth, then do so.
- How can you encourage others to use their gifts? Thank an altar server for their assistance at Mass; send a card to those who work in the food bank; support efforts to bring different cultures at your parish together.

#### Pentecost

Pentecost is the complement and the completion of Easter. Easter gives us the beginning of supernatural life and incorporation in Christ. But this new life must unfold; it must be strengthened and enkindled into a burning fire which can resist all things; it must be imbued with a love which is stronger than death, so that we are prepared to suffer all things Christ, even the sacrifice of our life. This strengthening of our spirit is brought about by our baptism with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The spirit of Pentecost is the spirit that makes the confessors and martyrs. It gives light, power, and unconquerable strength. This effect is visible in the apostles, who "went from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were accounted worthy to suffer reproach for the name of Jesus" (Acts 5:41). -CatholicCulture.Org
