REFLECTION

THE GENEROSITY AND KINDNESS OF OUR GOD.

Today's Gospel parable is about God's love and generosity. God is always searching for us; He would like us to come to Him right away. However, He accepts us whatever time He finds us. This parable of God's Kingdom assures us that whenever God finds us, the reward is the same as with those He found earlier. All receive complete acceptance, forgiveness of sins and eternal life.

In earlier times, some Christians took this as a reason to put off conversion and to wait until the end of life to be baptized. This is a complete misunderstanding of God's love. God wants to love us now! God wants to share His life with us now! Today is the day of salvation. Tomorrow is not guaranteed.

This parable wants us to appreciate the generosity of God who, whenever we turn to Him, is there to receive us. God always loves us and is always inviting us every moment. We must live in ways which respond to God's unconditional love. Our Lord comes at different moments seeking our attention and inviting us to engage in services in His vineyard, the Church.

We must not be envious of God's generosity to those we consider latecomers or undeserving. His ways are not our ways. Our task is to have hearts that are rich in grace and love of God, and hearts that are grateful that our Salvation is freely offered.

Practice of Hope

Jesus is always telling his followers what the kingdom of heaven is like. Using parables, he tries to illustrate for us the truth expressed by Isaiah in the first reading: God's thoughts are not our thoughts, nor his ways our ways. To us, with our pettiness and parsimony, God's abundant love and mercy are an unfathomable mystery. In fact, this mystery is *grace*, and it is God's grace that is our greatest source of hope. No matter how assiduously we defend our worthiness as opposed to the unworthiness of others, the grace of God confounds these efforts, leaving us at once confused and hopeful. In the face of such incomprehensible love, what can we do but surrender?

- Surrendering to grace is an expression of hope. Pray the Act of Hope and teach it to a young person.
- How has living God's ways changed your life?
- Which of God's ways strike you as strange?

Archdiocese of Newark

September 18–24 is National Migration Week here in the United States of America.

For the past ten years, Pope Francis has urged us to pay closer attention to the circumstances surrounding the migration of peoples. He has challenged us to actually see the faces of these brothers and sisters of ours rather than regard them as simply statistics or, worse, problems imposed on us by forces outside our control. "Migrants flee because of poverty, fear or desperation," the Holy Father says. "Eliminating these causes and thus putting an end to forced migration calls for shared commitment on the part of all, in accordance with the responsibilities of each. This commitment begins with asking what we can do, but also what we need to *stop doing.*"
