REFLEXIONES DEL BOLETÍN DE CORRESPONSABILIDAD 24 de diciembre de 2023

La Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José

"...Como el Señor los ha perdonado, así deben ustedes perdonar." - COLOSENSES 3-13

Perdonar es una de las cosas difíciles para las personas. No podemos dar lo que no tenemos. Necesitamos recibir la misericordia y el perdón de Dios antes de darlos a otras personas. Acérquese al sacramento de la Reconciliación y reciba la misericordia y el perdón de Dios. Entonces, comparta el don del perdón con alguien - un miembro de la familia, un amigo o un compañero de trabajo. Tome su teléfono y llame o envíe un mensaje de texto a alguien, justo en este momento.

Scripture Insights

Joseph and Mary offer in the Temple for Jesus' birth "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Such an offering is prescribed in Leviticus 12 for the poor who cannot afford a lamb or a sheep. From this, we can deduce that Luke's Jesus is born into a poor family. The image of the newborn Jesus lying in a manger is consistent with this picture. Given the less-than-desirable circumstances of Jesus' birth, it may be difficult for the couple to hold on to the angel's pronouncement to Mary about Jesus (1:30-33), especially given Simeon's words to Mary that "you yourself a sword will pierce" (Luke 2:35).

- Whose example do you lean on when your faith wavers?
- How do you imagine God's faithfulness?
